What's it like being a student at Moody Bible Institute? Here are a few insider tips on what to expect as you learn all about life at Moody.

Chapel is required for all students and takes place every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday (When Experience Moody happens, Chapel is on Friday instead of Thursday). Make sure to bring your phone to "check in" for attendance.

RA stands for Resident Assistant. Resident Assistants are trained student leaders who can help support you as you navigate your time at Moody. They also have a Lead Team of other students on the floor that help the floor community thrive.

Life Groups are small groups that take place on every floor on a weekly basis. These are led by a Life Group Leader who also lives on your floor. Attending life groups can be a great way to get plugged into your floor.

Did you know that Moody has **24 student groups** that host over **150 events** a year? Most student groups do not require special membership—that means you are welcome to join their events whenever you see them promoted! Check out the Student Activities weekly newsletter (sent to your Moody email) to see what events are coming up.

A special part of life at Moody is that we host two world-class conferences during the academic year–right here on campus! **Founder's Week** takes place in October, and **Missions Conference** takes place in February. Conference attendance is mandatory for all students.

Throughout the year, we have **several breaks** where students are able to go home or travel. These include Fall Break, Thanksgiving Break, Christmas Break, Spring Break, Easter Break, Summer Break, and a few one-day holidays scattered throughout. For Christmas, Spring, and Summer Break, the campus is closed down and only students who submit RRR requests may stay on campus. Keep an eye out for more information when we near these breaks.

U-PASS PROGRAM

As a new student at Moody, you are automatically enrolled into our U-Pass program. What's a U-Pass? A U-Pass lets you use the CTA (Chicago Transit Authority) trains and buses around the city an unlimited number of times during the semester!

If you did not receive a U-Pass in your welcome bag, make sure to submit a photo at the QR code to the right so that we can order your card right away. We will notify you via your Moody email when your U-Pass has arrived – typically within two weeks. If you have any questions, reach out to studentactivities@moody.edu or visit us on ASC 2.
